Unit Name: Comparing Numbers

Common Core State Standards:

1.NBT.3 Compare two two-digit numbers based on meanings of the tens and ones digits, recording the results of comparisons with the symbols >, =, and <.

Essential Vocabulary:

- Compare
- Equal (Equal To)
- Greater Than/Less Than
- Groups

- More/Less
- Ones
- Tens

Unit Overview:

First Grade students use their understanding of groups and order of digits to compare two numbers by examining the amount of tens and ones in each number. After numerous experiences verbally comparing two sets of objects using comparison vocabulary (e.g., 42 is more than 31. 23 is less than 52, 61 is the same amount as 61.), first grade students connect the vocabulary to the symbols: greater than (>), less than (<), equal to (=).

Strategies/Skills:

Mathematically proficient students communicate precisely by engaging in discussion about their reasoning using appropriate mathematical language.

First grade students should be able to:

- Compare numbers through 120 using terms such as more/less and greater than/less than/ or equal to.
- Identify if a number is more or less using their knowledge of tens and ones.
- Determine if a number is more or less using their knowledge of numbers. First grade students can think about the order of the numbers when counting and the numbers placement on a number line (with lesser numbers coming first).
