## Addition & Subtraction (Quarter 1)

### **Common Core State Standards:**

#### **Unit Overview:**

In the first part of the unit, students will build upon their work in First Grade by using various addition and subtraction strategies in order to fluently add and subtract within 20.

In the second part of the unit, students extend their work with addition and subtraction by solving a variety of word problems in two major ways. First, they represent and solve word problems within 100, building upon their previous work to 20. In addition, they represent and solve one and two-step word problems of all three types (Result Unknown, Change Unknown, Start Unknown). Rather than a letter ("n"), boxes or pictures are used to represent the unknown number. For a list of story problem types, please click the link to the NCDPI Unpacking Document, which is located in the additional resources section.

Throughout this unit, second graders are expected to explain why addition or subtraction strategies work. They may use drawings or objects to support their explanation. Second Graders are not expected to use the formal algorithm at this time. The focus is on developing and strengthening their conceptual understanding.
