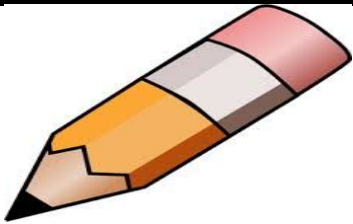
Our Learning

In writing, we have been learning to write opinion/persuasive stories and letters. By the end of this unit, your child should be able to write a beginning to get their readers' attention, state their topic and opinion about their topic, give at least one reason to support their opinion, and write an ending for their piece. Children will continue working on conventions: spelling, capitalization, spacing, and punctuation.







Math

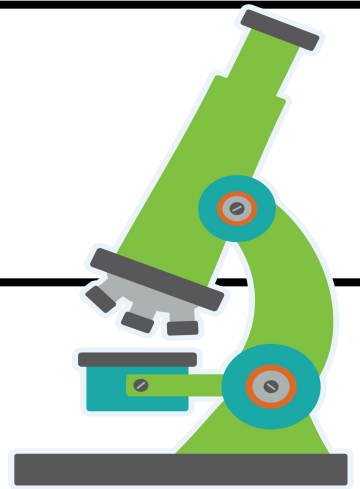
“To learn mathematics is to do mathematics!”

In math, we are continuing to build our understanding of place value (two-digits numbers have a tens and ones place and the value of each number), They will use this information to compare numbers to find what is more/less. They will also be continuing their work with addition and subtraction word problems and showing how these problems can be represented through objects and/or drawings.
